The Paired samples t-test was used to investigate the differences between students' mean scores from the pre and post reading comprehension test and the reading self-efficacy questionnaire. The results of the analyses revealed that (1) the posttest mean scores from English reading comprehension test of lower secondary school students at different reading achievement levels were higher than the pretest mean scores at the significance level of 0.05 and (2) the posttest mean scores from reading self-efficacy questionnaire of lower secondary school students at different reading achievement levels were higher than the pretest mean scores at the significance level of 0.05. Lower secondary school students at different reading achievement levels improved their reading comprehension and their reading self-efficacy after receiving Concept-Oriented English Reading Instruction. Differences in performance of 72 Chilean students with reading disabilities from public and private schools on decoding, reading comprehension, and listening comprehension tasks were investigated. Data analyses showed different profiles in students' performance depending upon their social background. Most students from disadvantaged backgrounds (i.e., public schools in Chile) exhibited low performance on decoding, reading comprehension, and listening comprehension measures, while most students from adequate social backgrounds (i.e., private schools in Chile) performed well on decoding but below average on reading comprehension and listening comprehension measures.
