This quantitative analysis of foods plays an important role not only in obtaining the required information for the purposes of nutritional labelling but also in ensuring that foods conform to desired flavour and texture quality attributes. This book outlines the range of techniques available to the food analyst and the theories underlying the more commonly used analytical methods in food studies.
